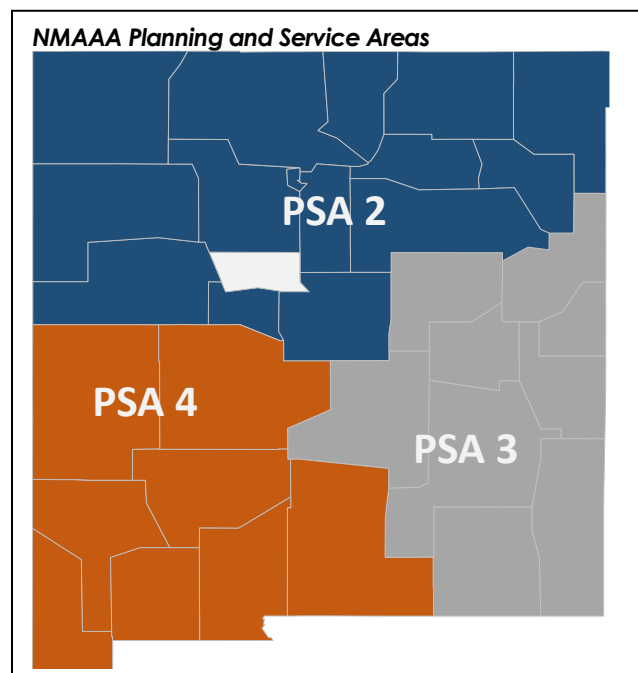




Request for Qualifications FY 23-09
Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, or Nurse

The North Central New Mexico Economic Development District (NCNMEDD) Non-Metro Area Agency on Aging (NMAAA) is seeking one or more Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapist, or Nurse licensed to work in New Mexico to assist statewide (except for Bernalillo County), regionally, or in multiple or specific counties with our new home modification program for seniors. Specifically, in cooperation with the NMAAA Housing Coordinator the applicant will work to assist with the development of related processes, provide the in-home assessments, and project follow through for the home modifications for identified seniors. This program is intended to assist low-income seniors 60+ to remain living safely in their residence and allow them to age in place. The program is modeled after the [Community Aging in Place | CAPABLE | School of Nursing at Johns Hopkins University \(jhu.edu\)](http://Community Aging in Place | CAPABLE | School of Nursing at Johns Hopkins University (jhu.edu)). The scope of services will vary by assignment but may include the following.

- Using the NMAAA home modification assessment tool, provide the in-home assessment and written report of needed modifications to NMAAA Housing Coordinator.
- Work with clients, family members, and caregivers to ensure their involvement, understanding, and approval of modification needs.
- Along with the Housing Coordinator work with contractors to ensure that approved Home Modifications are being completed in a timely and correct manner.
- Upon project completion, provide the final walk-through to assure that all work has been completed and meets all the requirements as stated on the written plan.
