Eligible Applicants: Applicants must be U.S. owned and based entities. A U.S. Person is defined as an individual that is a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence. An eligible entity is a workforce intermediary or an eligible sponsor of a pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship program that: has experience in implementing and providing career planning and career pathways; has knowledge of the technician workforce needs of the laboratory or facility and the associated security requirements; and is eligible to enter into an agreement with the laboratory or facility that would be paid for in part or entirely from grant funds received under this section.

A local educational agency, a secondary school, a provider of adult education, an area career and technical education school, or an institution of higher education (such as a community college); or an apprenticeship program that was registered with the Department of Labor or a State apprenticeship agency before the date on which the eligible entity applies for the grant; works with the Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, or veterans organizations to transition members of the Armed Forces and veterans.
